Climate Change

Community Channel's Climate Change season runs throughout December 2009 and January 2010.

It coincides with the UN Conference on Climate Change in Copenhagen (7 – 18 Dec 2009) at which the international community will negotiate an agreement on cutting carbon emissions and sign up to other climate change policies.

Our season includes major programmes and series on TV and online on climate change and environmental issues and supports the 10:10 campaign in the UK to cut carbon emissions by 10% in 2010.

This factsheet provides information on how you can enhance your green living, measure your own impact and cut your carbon footprint. It also lists some organisations which are committed to protecting the environment and raising awareness of climate change.
